






- Total number of prosecutions for sexual abuse crimes



- Number of victims for intolerance-motivated sexual abuse crimes
























Involvement of Witness and Victim Coordinator in Sexual Abuse Crimes

Trends

- In 2021-2023, for crimes against sexual freedom and sexual inviolability prosecution was launched against a total of **885** individuals, and **941** individuals were granted victim status;
- In 2021-2023, for intolerance-motivated crimes against sexual freedom and sexual inviolability prosecution was launched against a total of **116** individuals, and **122** individuals were granted victim status;
- In comparison to the figure of 2021, the 2022 prosecution rate on intolerance-motivated sexual abuse crimes has increased by **57,6**% and the 2023 rate by **88,4**%;
- In comparison to the figure of 2021, the 2022 rate of granting victim status on intolerance-motivated sexual abuse crimes has increased by **51,8**%, and the 2023 rate by **100**%;
- In 2021, **15.3** % of defendants prosecuted for intolerance-motivated sexual abuse had committed respective crimes with intersectional discrimination motive, i.e. gender and nationality, gender and religion, gender and disability;
- In 2021-2023, **43.1**% of defendants prosecuted for intolerance-motivated sexual abuse had committed the crime against a family member;
- In 2021-2023, **36.2** % of defendants prosecuted for intolerance-motivated sexual abuse had committed the crime against their spouses, and **22.4** % against their intimate partners;
- In 2021-2023, all individuals prosecuted for intolerance-motivated sexual abuse crimes are adult males.

Trends

- The hate crime statistical data are processed on the basis of the updated memorandum of cooperation signed on October 5, 2023 between the Prosecutor's Office of Georgia, the Ministry of Internal Affairs, the Special Investigation Service, the Supreme Court and the National Statistics Office. <a href="https://www.geostat.ge/media/57913/%E1%83%9B%E1%80%9B%E1%80%9B%E1%80%9B%E1%80

- Procedural supervision of investigation as well as prosecutorial activities on crimes against sexual freedom and sexual inviolability as well as on hate crimes, are conducted by specialized prosecutors;
- Statistical recording of cases of gender-based violence against women is carried out in accordance with the requirements of the Istanbul Convention "THE BIG FIVE" standard.

Challenges

- Timely identification of the intolerance motive indicators in the cases of sexual abuse crimes and reflection of the intolerance motive in investigative/procedural documents;
- Examination of all possible motives for crime in order to identify intersectional discrimination;
- The victim's refusal to testify against the close relative.
